- Click on the Pages per sheet and choose the number 2, 4, 6, 9, 16, or custom.




Word Cards

The activities you can do with word cards are endless! Here are a few things I do with them:

- Post the cards in a pocket chart with the included writing paper in the writing center.
- Build the word with magnet letters.
- Build the word with letter manipulatives (letter beads, letter Legos, clothespin letters, etc.).
- · Write the words on included themed writing paper.
- · Write the words in shaving cream.
- Write the words in a salt/sand tray.
- · Write the words on a dry erase board.
- Write the words on a chalkboard. Click <u>HERE</u> to see how to make your own student chalkboards.
- Make the words using stickers.
- Stamp the words in play dough.
- Post the words around the classroom for write the room.
- Hole punch the cards and put on a metal ring for students to use in their writing.
- Clap and sort by number of syllables.
- · Sort the words by number of letters.





Print the cards on cardstock for greater durability and laminate.

Directions:

Using Playdoh: Students pick a letter card, roll playdoh snakes, and form the letter with the playdoh.

Using Manipulatives: Students pick a letter card and place the manipulatives on the letter. Mini erasers or small Halloween manipulatives would be super fun to use.

Using Dry Erase Markers: Students pick a letter and trace the letter using a dry erase marker.

Playdoh Recipes

basic playdoh

What you Need:

2 cups of flour, I cup of salt, 4 tsp. of cream of tartar, 2 cups of water, 2 Tbsp. of vegetable oil, and food coloring or liquid watercolor

How to Make it:

Measure and mix all ingredients together in a saucepan off the heat until all the clumps are gone. Put it on the stove and set it to a medium heat. Continuously stir the mixture. When it pulls away from the sides of the pan and forms one large ball, it is done (if any of the dough is sticky it needs to cook a bit longer). Let it cool. Knead the dough and have FUN! Once completely cooled, store the dough in a air tight bag (no need to refrigerate).

- Kool-Aid



















Pumpkin letters

- •Students pick a sight word card (included) and build it with the pumpkin letters.





Included are 3 different Build A Pattern pages for you to choose from. Students can use the pieces or draw their own pattern.


