Select the pages you want to print. Select "FIT" to ensure it prints correctly and doesn't cut off the edges.





Shamrock craftivity

Develop scissor skills and fine motor strength with this craftivity.

Print on white or colored paper. The teacher can cut out the shamrock, or for extra scissor skills practice, students can cut out the shamrock.

There are many ways you can make this fine motor craft.

- Cutting Paper Strips: Cut plain or patterned scrapbook paper into half inch strips. Students cut the strips and glue to the shamrock to create the collage.
- Tape: Cut pieces of different patterns of washi tape and tape it to the shamrock to create the collage.
- Torn Paper: Tear paper to create a torn paper collage.
- Tissue Paper Collage: Crumble up tissue paper squares and glue to the object. Add glitter to make it sparkle! Glitter hack: place glitter in a saltshaker to make it easy for students to use.
































































Word Cards

The activities you can do with word cards are endless! Here are a few things I do with them:


- Post the cards in a pocket chart with the included writing paper in the writing center.
- Build the word with magnet letters.
- Build the word with letter manipulatives (letter beads, letter Legos, clothespin letters, etc.).
- · Write the words on included themed writing paper.
- Write the words in shaving cream.
- Write the words in a salt/sand tray.
- Write the words on a dry erase board.
- Write the words on a chalkboard. Click <u>HERE</u> to see how to make your own student chalkboards.
- Make the words using stickers.
- · Stamp the words in play dough.
- · Post the words around the classroom for write the room.
- Hole punch the cards and put on a metal ring for students to use in their writing.
- Sort the words by number of letters.

You will need 10 markers in one color and 10 markers in another color. If you are playing Count Bump (board with I of each number), only give each player 5 counters each. Linking cubes work the best because they connect but you can use any markers you have.

How to Play

- Students take turns rolling the dice and covering the number rolled.
- If the other player's marker is on the number, you can BUMP the other player's marker off the board and place your marker there. Your partner gets their marker back and can use it again.
- If your marker is on the number, you can link/stack your markers and that spot is "locked". Once a spot is locked it can't be bumped again.
- The game is over when one player runs out of markers.

- + Bump: use one die, add one
- - I Bump: use one die, subtract one
















IEPPECHAUN traps & positional words

Students need to explore and develop positional word concepts using REAL objects.

Two Ways to Play

STEM Challenge: Students pick a STEM Building Challenge Card then Identify the positional word. Students build a leprechaun trap and place the leprechaun on the trap in the correct place.

Act It Out: Each student builds a leprechaun trap. Pick a card. Students or teacher says what the position is and moves the object to the correct place.

Leprechauns & Building Supplies

Leprechauns: If you do not have the leprechaun figures in your classroom, use the included leprechaun cards. Cut out and fold on the dotted line to make it stand up.

Building Supplies: Use blocks and/or recyclable building supplies (paper towel tubes, cups, small boxes, cardboard, paper plates, netting). Add in green supplies such as green crepe paper, green cups, green bowls, St. Patrick's Day paper plates, green plastic silverware and most of this you can find at the Dollar Tree.





















































