MONKY!

You MUST open, edit, and print this product in Adobe Reader from a COMPUTER (not your phone) or NOT in preview mode (aka through your internet browser). You can download Adobe Reader for FREE online https://get.adobe.com/reader/

Select the pages you want to print. Select "FIT" to ensure it prints correctly and doesn't cut off the edges.

Do NOT PRINT FROM YOUR PHONE. Some have a glitch that makes the formatting crazy. Always print from a computer in Adobe Reader.



ALWAYS OPEN & PRINT PDFS IN ADOBE READER!



mitten cutting craftivity

Develop scissor skills and fine motor strength with this craftivity.

Print on white or colored paper. The teacher can cut out the mittens, or for extra scissor skills practice, students can cut out the mittens. Students can make one mitten or make a set of mittens.


There are many ways you can make this fine motor craft. Glue cotton balls to mitten border and add a ribbon to connect the pair!


- Cutting Paper Strips: Cut plain or patterned scrapbook

- · Torn Paper: Tear paper to create a torn paper collage.













The activities you can do with word cards are endless! Here are a few things I do with them:


- Post the cards in a pocket chart with the included writing paper in the writing center.
- · Build the word with magnet letters.
- Build the word with letter manipulatives (letter beads, letter Legos, clothespin letters, etc.).
- · Write the words on included themed writing paper.
- · Write the words in shaving cream.
- Write the words in a salt/sand tray.
- Write the words on a dry erase board.
- Write the words on a chalkboard. Click <u>HERE</u> to see how to make your own student chalkboards.
- Make the words using stickers.
- Stamp the words in play dough.
- Post the words around the classroom for write the room.
- Hole punch the cards and put on a metal ring for students to use in their writing.
- Sort the words by number of letters.
























































Trace the Letters



ice fishing for letters & sounds?

This is a fun activity students can do to practice identifying letters and sounds.

Print the cards and laminate. For a pop of color, print the blackline option on colored paper to save ink.

To make the "ice fishing hole" cover a plastic bin or a box with white paper or parchment paper. Cut a hole in the top for students to "fish" from. Place magnet letters inside for the fish. Students use a magnet wand or a magnet fishing pole to "fish" for the letters.



snowflake play dok counting mats

Playdoh counting mats are a fun way for students to build one-to-one correspondence, number recognition, and fine motor strength!

Playdoh mats can be used as an arrival activity, center activity, or small group activity.

Print the cards on cardstock for greater durability and laminate. You can purchase playdoh or make your own. If you don't want to use playdough, use any snow counters, cotton balls, gems, white pom poms, or white cubes for "snow".

How to Play

Count It Out!

•Students roll balls with the playdoh to create snowflakes. Students make the corresponding number of snowflakes as the number on the card.

Make the Number!

•Students can also practice forming the number by rolling playdoh snakes to create the number or by tracing the number with a dry erase marker.



Play Dough Recipes

basic playdough

What you Need:

2 cups of flour, I cup of salt, 4 tsp. of cream of tartar, 2 cups of water, 2 Tbsp. of vegetable oil, and food coloring or liquid watercolor

How to Make it:

Measure and mix all ingredients together in a saucepan off the heat until all the clumps are gone. Put it on the stove and set it to a medium heat. Continuously stir the mixture. When it pulls away from the sides of the pan and forms one large ball, it is done (if any of the dough is sticky it needs to cook a bit longer). Let it cool. Knead the dough and have FUN! Once completely cooled, store the dough in an air tight bag (no need to refrigerate).



























































build a snowman: count or add

Print on cardstock and laminate for durability or use the blackline option.

Use cotton balls, mini erasers, gems, pom poms, or buttons for snow. You can also use the blackline version with dot markers or stickers. This game can be played with a peer or individually.

How to Play

COUNTING 1-6 (use one die)

- Students take turns rolling the die, counting the dots, and counting out the corresponding number of snowballs. Play until the snowman is covered in snowballs. ADDING (use two dice)
- Students take turns rolling the dice, adding the total number of dots, and counting out the total corresponding number of snowballs.








hot chocolate count or add mats

This is a fun activity students can do to develop one-to-one correspondence and to represent addition with objects and equations.

Print the boards. Then laminate or place the boards in dry erase pockets.

How to Play

Counting Mat: Students pick a domino and place it on the mat. Then count the dots on the domino and find it on the number line. Students count out the corresponding number of "marshmallows" and "chocolate chips" and place it on the mug. Lastly, clear the board and play again!

Addition Mat: Students pick a domino and place it on the mat. Then count the dots on the domino and complete the equation with a dry erase marker. Students count out the corresponding number of "marshmallows" and "chocolate chips" and place it on the mug. Lastly, clear the board and play again!



Low many bears are kiding?

How many are hiding is a fun game to decompose (subtract) numbers.


You pick the number you want students to decompose. For example, if you want students to practice decomposing the number 5, only put out 5 bears.

Options

- Print and laminate the boards and game pieces. Cut out the game pieces close to the picture.
- Print just the boards. Use counters or mini erasers for the bears. Use a bowl or cup to "hide" the bears.

How to Play

- I. Player I closes their eyes and player 2 hides some/none of the bears under the object and places remaining on the board.
- 2. Player I opens their eyes and guesses how many are hiding. Player I has to count the number of bears they see and subtract that number from the set.
- Both players look under the object and count to see how many were hiding.
- Switch and keep playing! Students take turns being player I and player 2.






















