the better ones.



Broken, Dead
or Diseased trees
should all be
taken.

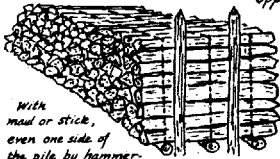


The Light Hog:
Perhaps a mature,
beautiful tree ready
for cutting. If it is
getting old, it is
best to cut it.

Woodpile Cutting -

With the Chain saw...

Cut protruding sticks off
opposite side.

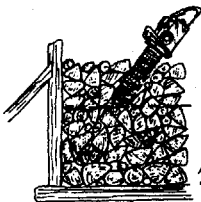


With
maul or stick,
even one side of
the pile by hammer-
ing odd sticks back in.

Mark top layer of
pile where you
will slice down
with chainsaw.

Bottom skids
placed to meet
the pile-slices.

Operator's View:
Step on or above every
stick you cut or it may
fly at you.



Large saw is best. Cut
by layers. Clean top of cut
pieces & sawdust, mark
again & repeat.
